Ambiyo and Mahat worry every day about having enough food to feed their children and being able to provide for them in the future. Mahat says, 'I am thinking about a different future altogether. I want to be independent.'

God's Will

We are called to put God first in every aspect of our lives, so that God's will may be done. It is the unmerited, unearned, gift of God (which we call Grace) that begins, prepares, sustains and perfects this call to holiness, and elicits our free response to God to become his children. Grace is ...

"the outcome of God's mercy."

(ST I-II,q.3.a.3)

Its goal is to draw us to eternal life with God.

Types of Grace

There two main types of grace: Sanctifying grace and Actual grace.

- Sanctifying grace is a habitual grace that is meant to be with us always. Although it can be lost by mortal sin, it may be restored in the sacrament of reconciliation.
- Actual grace is called a transient grace, as it is only given when we need it, for example, to carry out a good act.

In addition, there are 'sacramental graces', and 'special graces' (charisms) which are at 'the service of charity and the building up the Church' (CCC2003).

Effects of Grace

Aquinas teaches that grace has five effects:

- firstly, to heal the soul;
- secondly, to desire the good;
- thirdly, to carry into effect the good proposed;
- fourthly, to persevere in the good, and
- fifthly, to reach glory (ST I-II,q.111,a.3).

By grace we share in God's life, which is the source and goal of the call to holiness. It empowers us to believe, to live as disciples of Christ, to worship, to do good works and to fight against the draw of sin. By doing so, we deepen our faith and grow in holiness.

What is this Grace?

By God's Grace

Holiness is only possible by the love and grace of God. St Thomas Aquinas, theologian and philosopher, defines holiness as ...

'that virtue by which our mind applies itself and all its acts to God'. (Thomas Aquinas)

To be holy, literally, means to be 'set apart'. Through our baptism, God sets us apart so that we can be truly like him. We are made holy by God – it is his initiative. For us, to be holy, is to be called ...
