and John had success in converting people to Christ. In Samaria they prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit; and it happened! The apostles and the Samaritans together recognised something of the mystery of the Holy Spirit.

Just as our breathing sustains our lives, so the Holy Spirit moves us outwards from ourselves as surely and as swiftly as the wind drives Peter Lawless on his epic voyage.

Jesus Did not Abandon His Followers

We are curious creatures, us humans: we seek certainty in science and even in religion. However, Jesus knew us better than we know ourselves so he promised to send the Advocate as a helper, to be with us always. Because he knew that his kingdom could not be built without help, Jesus did not leave his followers without the Spirit, then or now. Jesus, in John's gospel, reminds us that the Spirit is a ...

Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, since the world neither sees her nor recognises her.

Then Jesus says ...

but you can recognise the Spirit, because she remains with you and will remain in you. (John 14:17)

With God in the Beginning

When did you last experience the power of the Holy Spirit moving you? Have you ever prayed for the gift of the Holy Spirit to come to you and remain in you?

I cannot see the Holy Spirit ... because the Spirit is like the wind; but I know the Spirit is there as an animating force in my life. The Spirit who was 'with God in the beginning' is that same Spirit within each one of us. I rest in the warmth of the Spirit, especially when I'm under the weather, knowing the Spirit will bring me healing and give me the energy for building the kingdom, just as the Spirit did for Philip, Peter and John in Samaria over two thousand years ago.

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

The Spirit Among us



Gospel Writers

The gospel writers all share the belief that Jesus rose from the dead. That faith in the risen Jesus was founded by the Holy Spirit, even before Pentecost.

During this time before Pentecost, however, the disciples struggled to understand *why* Jesus had called them, and for *what* he was preparing them. They couldn't see the Holy Spirit in the way they had seen Jesus; but nevertheless they were energised by the Spirit.

Power of the Spirit

The Spirit gave the apostles courage and confidence to travel to foreign places like Samaria, where Philip, Peter
