#### The Noise of Noise

C.S. Lewis, in his famous book, "The Screwtape Letters", depicts the fictional letters of a senior demon to his nephew on how to draw people of faith away from God. In one of the letters, the senior demon encourages the junior to make sure that the lives of the faithful are filled with noise; silence was to be avoided at all costs. Their plan was to make the world a place of total noise, thus making sure that the gentle voice of God would be drowned out by noise.

Though fictitious in concept, the reality is overwhelmingly true. Our lives and the entire world have become so busy, so noisy, that we rarely pause to be silent. Hence, many people even dread silence.

#### The Gift of Silence

We are called to enter deliberately into the gift of silence because it is in stillness that God is found. This is profoundly true of the presence of the Eucharist.

St Teresa of Calcutta reminds us that the fruits of silence are prayer, faith, love, service and peace. How are we to hear the cry of the Lord from the Cross, 'I Thirst', unless we take the time to listen.

St Catherine of Siena encourages us to bring our contemplation – our still and silent awareness of God – into our hearts and every part of our lives. Our task is 'to contemplate and share with others the fruits of our contemplation'.

Following the example of the monks of *Le Grand Chartreuse*, we gift ourselves the space to listen well and, by definition, to become more obedient to the call of God. Let us 'Listen to Him' ... to the one who calls us by name.

#### Summary

The fruits of silence are prayer, faith, love, service and peace.

It is in silence that the voice of the Father is heard.

Noise drowns out the gentle voice of God.

#### Ouestion

How do we enter into silence with a willingness to hear?

#### Prayer

Lord, I want to see you in others, and hear your voice in the silence of my heart.


In 1984, the film-maker Philip Gröning wrote to the monks of the Carthusian Monastery of Le Grande Chartreuse in the French Alps asking for permission to document their way of life. Receiving a positive reply after 16 years, Gröning spent 6 months filming the lives of these monks, and after a further two and half years of editing, the film 'Into Great Silence' was released in 2005.

This multi-award winning movie had no film crew, no special effects, and no spoken commentary. It used only natural lighting; it recorded the sounds and pictures of the monks austere, silent, faith-filled life. Yet this film drew millions of viewers into packed cinemas all over the world, drawn into stillness and silence ... an unexpected mini-retreat for the soul. As one commentator said.

"Here is a film that dares to explore the possibility of finding God, a God who is there for those who seek him with their whole hearts'.
