Sunday Evening Mass (with Gospel Choir) resumed in Our Lady of Victories Church last Sunday 10th September at 6.00pm.



The writer of *Ecclesiasticus* was wise in calling us to account, reminding us of the importance of forgiveness, even our duty to forgive. God challenges us to leave resentment and anger behind, to stop hating each other and be merciful, just as God has been merciful with us.

#### From Old to New Testament

180 years before Jesus, the people of Israel knew an Almighty God who was compassionate and merciful. Fast forward to 70 years after the death of Jesus, the writer of the gospel of Matthew presents Jesus as the fulfilment of the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms.

## Hope in the Middle of War

In February of this year, Pope Francis, on his visit to Sudan, encountered a group of over a million people displaced due to the ongoing civil war. Pope Francis noted that, despite the painful circumstances of their lives, they hadn't lost their faith, or hope for a better future.

"Be seeds of hope, which make it possible for us to glimpse the tree that one day hopefully in the near future, will bear fruit. True, right now you are 'planted' where you do not want to be, but precisely from this situation of hardship and uncertainty, you can reach out to those around you and experience that you are all rooted in the one human family." (Pope Francis)

He went on to encourage them to be seeds of hope by choosing "fraternity and forgiveness" with people of other ethnicities and origins.

#### The Path of Reconciliation

In the gospel of Matthew, Peter puts this question to Jesus: "Lord, if my siblings sin against me, how often must I forgive them? As many as seven times?" If I only respond to injustice with resentment, I will allow myself to be poisoned by it. Forgiveness, then, becomes almost impossible. I say "almost", for we do have a real choice, like Pope Francis says, that we move from anger and resentment to fraternity and forgiveness, and so become seeds of hope on the path to reconciliation.



#### Summary

Jesus reminds the disciples of the importance of forgiveness if they are to truly be his disciples.

#### A better

understanding of 'fear of the Lord' might be "wonder and awe", or "reverence and respect" for the Almighty God of Creation.

The key to understanding the Book of Ecclesiasticus is the author's identification of "the fear of the Lord" with "wisdom".

## Question

What connects "wisdom" with "the fear of the Lord"?

#### Prayer

Lord, may my fear turn into awe, and my wonder into forgiveness.



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> "God is watching us, God is watching us, God is watching us, ... from a distance."

This song challenges my image of God, and while the lyrics are beautiful, it also raises questions for me about what kind of God might be watching us 'from a distance'. This is not a Christian God. Even though the song is frequently performed on Christian radio, there is no mention of the Incarnation or Calvary, and hence no concept of forgiveness. 0-0


The psalmist who composed Psalm 102, for example, paints a very different picture of God:

"The Lord is compassion and Love, slow to anger and rich in mercy. ... [who] forgives all our guilt, heals every one of our ills who redeems us from the grave and who crowns us with love and compassion." (Ps 203)

This image would suggest a God who is intimately connected with humanity, rather than watching from a distance.



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The psalmist paints a picture of a loving, compassionate God. Yet even here, God's mercy seems to have conditions because, further on, he reminds us that "strong is his love for <u>those who fear him</u>" (V.17).

Is 'fear of God' a condition? The *Book of Ecclesiasticus* speaks of God's 'vengeance', and of a God who keeps strict account of our sins. So what, then? *Ecclesiasticus* was written about 180 BC, and the key to understanding this great book is the author's identification of "the fear of the Lord" with "wisdom". For its author, "wisdom" consists primarily in the Law of Moses, especially in The Ten Commandments. It shows us that "wisdom" ultimately comes from "the fear of the Lord." But what did he mean by fear? A better understanding might be "wonder and awe", "reverence and respect" for the almighty God of creation.

## **Reciprocal Forgiveness**

When I look at God through the lens of wonder and awe (together with reverence and respect) it becomes easier for me to experience God's love and mercy at work in the world. If I believe that God has forgiven me, then I am duty-bound to forgive my neighbour.
