

The Shepherd

Chapter 40 from the *Book of Isaiah*, one of the most magnificent books in the Bible, is poetic and reassuring. It draws us into the presence of a patient God who consoles, and who is tender, caring and forgiving. The image of the shepherd gathering the lambs in his arms, cuddling them, and sensitively leading the tired mother ewes who had given birth to rest and shelter, is quite striking and gentle.

A Place for God

During the coming weeks it's important for us to find quality time in which we allow ourselves to experience the comforting God whose only desire is to hold us close to him. We allow him to caress us with his mercy and forgiveness. It requires effort and attentive listening.

A Place for Others

Is there someone in your life who is waiting and hoping to experience some of these beautiful God-like qualities? Is there some area in your own life that yearns for healing or forgiveness? Waiting is a challenge in a world that sees waiting as an inconvenience or a waste of time. Waiting needs to be open to surprise, open to an encounter with God who is waiting patiently for us, to give us that unexpected gift.

Getting Ready for Jesus

We are called during Advent to be ready to welcome Jesus coming among us to surprise us. In the second reading, we hear the voice of Peter calling us to do our best 'to live holy and saintly lives.' We give thanks for the men and women who, especially this Advent, give of their best to lift people out of their wildernesses of poverty, loneliness, homelessness and abandonment.

Who is Calling?

On this Advent Sunday, Isaiah, Peter, John the Baptist and the evangelist, St Mark, all summon us to be alert, to be attentive to the voices that are calling us to 'Prepare a way for the Lord, to make his paths straight ...' Advent challenges us to strive for the fullness of life, and to be life-givers to others,

Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!

Lord Jesus, may I learn from your patience, as you wait for me.





SUNDAY LETTER

Series: Spirituality; Second Sunday of Advent, Year A; 10th December 2023



This atmosphere blends gently with the sentiments of Psalm 84 which is read on this second Sunday of Advent:

'I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace ... his help is near ...'

These lines highlight the four great qualities that will assist us on our Advent quest for a deeper relationship with Emmanuel – mercy, faithfulness, justice and peace.



The Lord is Patient

Advent offers us the opportunity to slow down and take time to strip away some of the attitudes, biases and unhealthy masks that prevent us from mirroring the love of Jesus to those around us. Advent speaks of preparing, anticipating, waiting in faith and hope, and welcoming. God is patiently waiting for us to be ready.

God's waiting will meet our waiting. Our patient God allows us time; God waits at the door and knocks, waits to be invited in, waits to be a welcome guest, wants room in the inn of our heart.
