This is a living testimony to the love of Jesus. It was a grace-filled moment, nearly a year ago, to hear James Martin's dad speak after his Down Syndrome son won an Oscar for his part in 'An Irish Goodbye'.

#### Moving On ...

Every family has its ups and downs, disagreements and fallouts. Being able to rise above these upsets and move on with life is a special grace. It is never easy. In his Angelus address for this family feast two years ago, Pope Francis said:

"Each of us has our own story and the family is the story from which we originate ... Jesus too is the son of a family story ... we come from a story that was woven with the bonds of love ... If we cut ourselves off from our roots, life dries up! God did not create us to be lone rangers, but to walk together. God thinks about us and wants us to be together: grateful, united, capable of preserving our roots. And we have to think about this, about our own story." (Angelus: 26th Dec 2021)




Series: Morality; The Holy Family, Year B; 31 Dec 2023
