We become saints by being attentive to both God and our neighbour in the 'now'. If we live well in the present, we should not be afraid of the final coming of Christ.

Having Vigilance

The gospel this Sunday speaks of the need for vigilance for the Lord's coming. Vigilance is a very important word in our spiritual lives. There are many thieves who draw our attention away from Christ in the present moment; hence we guard our hearts with constant vigilance against these thieves. Life is a battle for the heart.

It is crucial to establish times of silent prayer every day, so that we can extend our awareness of God throughout the day. Having a time-slot when we focus explicitly on God and raise our minds and hearts to him, will make it more likely that we will do this at other times, when we are doing our chores and works.

Whenever we seek God in silence, we increase the habit of seeking him always. Searching for Christ in the here-and-now is an excellent way of being attentive to God.

SUNDAY LETTER

Series: The Seasons; First Sunday of Advent, Year B; 3rd December, 2023

Advent is a very important time in the life of the Church. It is the time when we pray in a special way for the virtue of hope. The famous French poet and writer Charles Peguy notes that hope is often overshadowed by her two imposing sisters – faith and charity.

People often forget to pray for hope.

Hope is a neglected virtue, and yet in our time hope is absolutely crucial for reinforcing faith and love. Thankfully, like any grace or virtue, hope can grow through prayer, and especially through the reception of the Eucharist.

Why is hope particular to
Advent? Well, Advent
reminds us of our
preparations for the final
coming of Christ in glory
at the end of time. This is
when Jesus will
overthrow all suffering
and evil, and definitively
establish the Kingdom
of God.



HOPE – A NEGLECTED VIRTUE

Christians await the second coming of Christ with great hope, without any disordered fear. Christians sometimes pray "Come Lord, but not yet till I am ready." It's true that if someone is in a state of sin they should dread that hour. However, once a Christian has repented and seeks the Lord, one should only have hope. This hope is founded on God's power to save and restore. It is precisely because we are walking in this sinful valley that we want the Lord to come with might to perfect us in Him. Christians await the return of their brother and Lord, Jesus, with expectancy and confidence.

He Comes in the Mundane

Advent is not only an opportunity to recall the second coming of Christ, it is also an opportunity to become more aware of the coming of Christ in the present – moment by moment – in the mystery of our individual lives.
